INTER-AMERICAN CONVENTION ON THE GRANTING OF CIVIL RIGHTS TO WOMEN

In the anniversary of the First Feminist Convention for the Rights of Women in Seneca Falls, held from July 19 to July 20, 1848, the History Commission commemorates the Inter-American Convention on the Granting of Civil Rights to Women, signed at the Ninth International Conference of American States in Colombia in 1948

Civil rights protect individual freedoms and guarantee the ability of the citizen to participate in the political life of the State on an equal basis, without any discrimination.

In Latin America, recognition of citizenship for women was established for the first time in Ecuador in 1929, followed by Chile and Uruguay in 1931, Brazil in 1932, Dominican Republic in 1942, Panama in 1945, Argentina and Venezuela in 1947, Costa Rica in 1949, El Salvador in 1950 and Bolivia in 1952. Mexico included it in its Magna Carta in 1953, Colombia a year later, in 1954; Honduras, Nicaragua and Peru in 1955; And Paraguay in 1961.

The Inter-American Convention on the Granting of Civil Rights to Women states: "That women have the right to equality with men in civil matters"; And in its First Article that "The American States agree to grant women the same civil rights as men enjoy."

SIMÓN BOLÍVAR

In the birth of Simón Bolívar (1783-1830), the History Commission presents a sketch of "Liberator of America".

Simón Bolívar was born in Caracas, Venezuela, on July 24, 1783; he was a military and politician, founder of the republics of Gran Colombia and Bolivia and one of the most outstanding figures of American emancipation against Spain. It contributed decisively in the processes of independence of the present Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Panama, Venezuela and the reorganization of Peru.

Bolívar carried out Admirable Campaigns, which constituted true military feats. In 1813 culminated with the independence of Venezuela. In 1817, his army crossed the Andes and consolidated the independence of Argentina, Chile

and Peru. Bolívar also participated in the founding of the Gran Colombia, a nation that tried to consolidate as a great political and military confederation.

The liberator makes in the *Jamaica Letter* in 1815 a balance of the independence efforts in the years from 1810 to 1815. This document sets out the causes and reasons that justified the decision of the Americans to fight for their independence. He makes arguments about the fate of Mexico, Central America, Venezuela, Buenos Aires, Chile and Peru. Finally, it reflects on the necessity of the union between the American countries.

By his political and historical legacy, Bolívar is one of the first people that support the pan-Americanism.
