
This virtual event was coordinated by Dr. Fernando Castillo Opazo, responsible for the "Archives" Working Group of the PAIGH History Commission, who was joined by Alba María Acevedo from the National University of Cuyo, Mendoza (Argentina), with her presentation "Archival Science for Historians. Reasons and Uses for Its Inclusion in a Curricula", and Dr. Fernando Vergara, from the Andrés Bello University (Chile), who discussed "Challenges and Good Practices in Archival Work."

The historians of the History Commission, Professor Luz María Méndez from the University of Chile, with her presentation -"Colonial Archives in Chile and Their Critical Content", and Dr. Ma. Elena Bedoya from the University, from San Francisco de Quito (Ecuador), participated with her speech "Thoughts from Microhistory and Comics: Building Alternative Narratives for Teaching History" Dr. Patricia Galeana, president of this Commission, gave the final lecture talking about -"Archive Normativity: Conservation and Access."



UPCOMING ANNIVERSARIES IN THE AMERICAN CONTINENT

DECEMBER 3RD 1854, Peru

Abolition of slavery.

DECEMBER 5TH 1958, Venezuela

Promulgation of the Law of Universities. The University Professor's Day is commemorated.

DECEMBER 6TH 1810, **Mexico**

Miguel Hidalgo promulgates the abolition of slavery and suppresses the castes.

DECEMBER 9th 2007

Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Ecuador, Paraguay, Uruguay and Venezuela sign the founding act of Banco del Sur.

DECEMBER 10th 1948

Ratification of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Human Rights Day is commemorated.

DECEMBER 11TH 1811, **Ecuador**

The Constituent Congress of the State of Quito is installed.

DECEMBER 11TH 1930, Chile

José Toribio Medina dies; he was the largest collector of historical sources of study in the country.

DECEMBER 13th 1960

Foundation of the Central American Bank for Economic Integration, integrated by Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua and Costa Rica.

DECEMBER 14TH 1982, Cuba

The historic center of Old Havana is enlisted as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DECEMBER 14th 2004

Foundation of the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of Our America. It is currently composed of Antigua and Barbuda, Bolivia, Cuba, Dominica, Granada, Nicaragua, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, and Venezuela. Haiti is an observer.

DECEMBER 16TH 1773, United States

Boston Tea Party: colonists

throw into the sea a load of tea, from three British ships as a rejection of taxes imposed.

DECEMBER 17TH 1830, Venezuela

Simón Bolívar dies. He was recognized as the Liberator of America.

DECEMBER 21st

1936, Bolivia

Creation of Yacimientos Petrolíferos Fiscales Bolivianos.

DECEMBER 22ND

1927, Nicaragua

Creation of the National Guard.

DECEMBER 24th

1726, Uruguay Foundation of Montevideo.

DECEMBER 27TH 1865, **Mexico**

Maximiliano promulgates the Law of Public Instruction, which stipulates basic education as free and mandatory.

DECEMBER 29TH 1775. Guatemala

Foundation of the city of Guatemala, capital of the Republic.
