

INTERNATIONAL MOTHER LANGUAGE DAY, FEBRUARY 21st



The International Mother Language Day was established by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNEsco) in November 1999, being celebrated for the first time in 2000. Its objective is to promote linguistic and cultural diversity, as well as multilingualism.

Much of the intangible heritage of humanity is determined by the peoples' ability to transmit their cultural traditions, and this is possible thanks to our native languages. Their preservation and use are essential to empower indigenous peoples and to build a fairer and more sustainable future for everyone, as indicated in the Sustainable Development Goals.

The UNESCO has pointed out that a large number of native languages are threatened with disappearing: "Every two weeks a language disappears taking with it an entire cultural and intellectual heritage."

The Mexican historian Miguel León Portilla wrote that "when a language dies, a window, a door, is closed to all the peoples of the world... When a language dies, humanity is impoverished."

Cultural and linguistic diversity enriches us. Building bridges for dialogue between different cultures is a fundamental task in order to become a society respectful that is respectful of differences. This is why this date constitutes an important strategy for the promotion of cultural diversity.


