• PAN AMERICAN DAY

In 1826, Simón Bolívar, then president of Peru, convened the governments of Colombia, Mexico, the United Provinces of River Plate, Chile, and months later Central America, to meet at the Congress of Panama. The objective of the meeting was the formation of “an assembly of plenipotentiaries of each State that would serve as a counsel in major conflicts, as a contact during common threats, as a faithful interpreter for misunderstandings in public treaties, and, in sum, as a conciliator of our differences.” The meetings culminated, however, without a concrete agreement.

In 1881 James G. Blaine, United States Secretary of State in charge of the international affairs, convened the First International Conference of American States in order to promote Pan Americanism. Those meetings continued to take place until 1889, when representatives of the American States met in Washington. This led to the creation of the International Union of the American Republics on April 14th, 1890.

The Union focused on issues of trade, agriculture, health, geography, history and other issues concerning regional progress. Later, this or-

ganization became the Pan American Union and, finally in 1948, it became the Organization of the American States (OAS).

The first Day of the Americas was celebrated on April 14, 1931, to commemorate the creation of the Union throughout the American continent, and as a symbol of sovereignty and voluntary union in a continental community.

This day is celebrated in 21 countries of the continent, and three nations have turned it into a national holiday: El Salvador, Guatemala and Haiti.

During the Day of the Americas celebration, people perform the Hymn of the Americas, with lyrics by Argentine pianist and composer Rodolfo Sciammarella.

Proposals can be sent to the Journal (antropologia.americana@gmail.com) and should include the following information:

1. Name or title of the theme of the dossier.
2. Objectives and justification of the theme (500 words).
3. A provisional list of possible articles that will be included in the dossier, and the names of participating writers, including a brief résumé for each.
4. The résumé of the coordinator of the thematic dossier.
5. The proposals will be considered by the Journal Editorial Committee. Proposals with an international perspective that include with authors from different regions in Latin America and the Caribbean will be privileged.
6. Once a proposal is accepted by the Editorial Committee, the coordinator (or coordinators) will be responsible for:
 - Posting the 'Call for papers' in collaboration with the Editorial Committee.
 - Contacting potential authors to collaborate on the thematic edition.
 - Carrying out a preliminary evaluation of the papers, together with the Editorial Committee of the journal.
 - Suggesting at least two peer reviewers for each paper.
7. All the articles will be peer reviewed according to the double-blind system.

Presentación Dossier

La emergencia de los Estados Nacionales en Hispanoamérica en las tres primeras décadas del siglo XIX bajo los moldes republicanos fue una experiencia inédita y en muchos casos pionera en el mundo atlántico. No obstante, a pesar de haberse consolidado ya cierta historiografía que versa sobre las elecciones, la ciudadanía, la cultura política, entre otras, aún hay vastos campos inexplorados o parcialmente trabajados sobre la organización de lo político en el continente. Uno de aquellos son los estudios sobre las formaciones armadas que como tempranamente lo afirmó Tullio Halperin Donghi en los años setenta del siglo pasado ya que las Guerras de Independencia se constituyó en otro legado más en nuestros noveles países.

En efecto, sus seminales afirmaciones solo empezaron a tener eco a finales del siglo XX, cuando diversos investigadores de la llamada Nueva Historia Política se percataron de la centralidad del Ejército y sus diversas modalidades (guardias nacionales, milicias nacionales o patrióticas, milicias cívicas, etc.) en la construcción del Estado, la ciudadanía, la invención de la Nación, así como también de su importancia para entender el ejercicio de participación en la arena política de los sectores plebeyos del campo y la ciudad.

En este orden de ideas, tales indagaciones permitieron ir identificando el proceso fortuoso de construcción del monopolio legítimo de la fuerza del Estado, sino que además abrió nuevas áreas problemáticas acerca del sentido de la ciudadanía armada, la importancia de las mujeres en la retaguardia de los ejércitos y la manera como se elaboraron nuevos horizontes de género que hasta ese momento no se habían identificado.

El presente Dossier, busca justamente continuar animando esta vía heurística que promete ya una renovación historiográfica de las narrativas de nuestro pasado, especialmente con un sector socio-profesional que hasta no hace muchos años fue anatemizado y considerado un obstáculo para el desenvolvimiento de los sistemas democráticos: los militares.

En este orden de ideas, animamos a diversos académicos del continente a contribuir con artículos y reseñas que versen sobre la importancia del ejército (regular, de línea o permanente), las guardias o milicias nacionales u otra organización armada (montoneras, cuerpos de gendarmería, guerrillas, etc.) en la construcción del Estado durante la centuria decimonónica y primeras décadas del XX. Igualmente, con temas afines que competen sobre la formación o educación militar u organizaciones afines como el montepío, la intendencia o la administración militar.
