THE HISTORY COMMISSION AWARDS

 $D^{\rm r.}$ Leopoldo Zea was a great Mexican philosopher who dedicated his life to study and spread the thinking of The Americas. He chaired the Committee on the "History of Ideas

in America" from 1947 to 2004 at the Pan American Institute of Geography and History (PAIGH), and was author of more than fifty fundamental publications for the understanding of the Ameri-

can continent. Some of said publications are: Dos etapas del pensamiento en Hispanoamérica (1949), América como conciencia (1953), América en la historia (1957), El pensamiento latinoamericano (1965), Filosofía de la historia en América (1976), Discurso desde la marginación y la barbarie (1988).

In 1999, the PAIGH created in his honor the Leopoldo Zea Award to recognize intellectuals who are distinguished for their distinguished carrier and contributions to philosophy in our continent. In its 2019 edition, Dr. Juan Guillermo Gómez García, scholar at the University of Antioquia (Colombia), will be awarded for his long career dedicated to the research, teaching, and promotion of the great Latin American schools of thought of the 19th and 20th centuries. His intellectual production is extensive focusing on Latin American intellectuals, thinkers, and teachers; just like Dr. Leopoldo Zea did.

The Best Master's Thesis Award in Pan American History was established in 2016. It aims to promote and recognize recent academic research, conducted by students and national researchers of the Member States of the PAIGH, or graduates from official master's programs of the universities located in any of those Member States. It is awarded in the general scope of Pan American History, in the 19th and 20th centuries.

This 2019, it will be given to the Colombian David Antonio Pulido García, who has master's degree in Latin American Studies. His thesis "Formar una nación de todas las hermanas" La joven intelectualidad colombiana ante el proyecto de integración latinoamericana del gobierno de Venustiano Carranza (1916-1920)", was presented in the Postgraduate Program in Latin American Studies of the National Autonomous University of Mexico and refers to a time when Pan-Americanism was going through changes of great significance. It analyzes different aspects involved in the construction of a Latin American identity through a national government project, and the response said project got from the youth in another country that received it.

In addition, research projects "Estrategias discursivas para sostener la violencia de Estado en contextos democráticos pos-dictaduras. Argentina-Uruguay" by Silvana Pera (Uruguay) and "Dejar el casco antiguo. Dos casos de modernización urbana en América Latina: Lima y la Ciudad de México 1895-1910" by Francisco Javier Navarro Jiménez (México), are, each of them recipients of an honorable mention for how their methodology and subject matter presents an analysis with a regional perspective.
