## • THE HISTORY COMMISSION'S AWARDS, 2019

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019, the History Commission Awards, 2019, took place at the Agustín Codazzi Geographical Institute, in Bogotá, Colombia.

Dr. Patricia Galeana began her intervention referring to the origin of the PAIGH, which creation

was proposed by the Mexican engineer Pedro C. Sánchez to resolve international border conflicts in coordination with the national geographic institutes. It was the Cuban delegation that suggested that the Institute should have a History area, and it was until 1946 when Dr. Silvio Zavala

made it happen. Zavala invited Dr. Leopoldo Zea to create a Committee on the History of Ideas in America, which the latter chaired from 1947 until his death in 2004.

Thereafter, Dr. Galeana referred to the great work of Dr. Zea, and highlighted the importance that the philosopher had given to History "as an imperative of Latin American philosophy." In his work *Pensamiento Latinoamericano*, the philosopher of the Americas wrote: If something defines man, it is history; it makes sense of what has been done, what is done, and what can be done. In the triple historical dimension, past, present and future, the being of man is evident.



The president of the History Commission pointed out that in 2019, the Jury decided to recognize the work of Dr. Juan Guillermo Gómez García of the University of Antioquia, for his contributions to research, teaching and promotion

of the great lines of Latin American thought of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. After receiving the Award, Dr. Gómez García referred to the work of Dr. Leopoldo Zea, pointing out that *at a time when the perpetual crisis in Latin America is sharpening once again, and demands all its occasional attention, I hope we could appreciate the great thinkers who preceded us, because they are a moral and a political heritage without which we could hardly give a better response to the general uncertainty and, in any case, without them, we will be more sure of misfortune.*



Dr. Galeana presented the Best Pan American History Thesis Award, highlighting the interest of the History Commission in supporting new generations of researchers and historians.



David Antonio Pulido García received this Award for his research "Formar una nación de todas las hermanas. La joven intelectualidad colombiana ante el proyecto de integración latinoamericana del gobierno de Venustiano Carranza (1916-

1920)", presented in the Postgraduate Program in Latin American Studies from the National Autonomous University of Mexico.

#### JANUARY 9<sup>TH</sup>

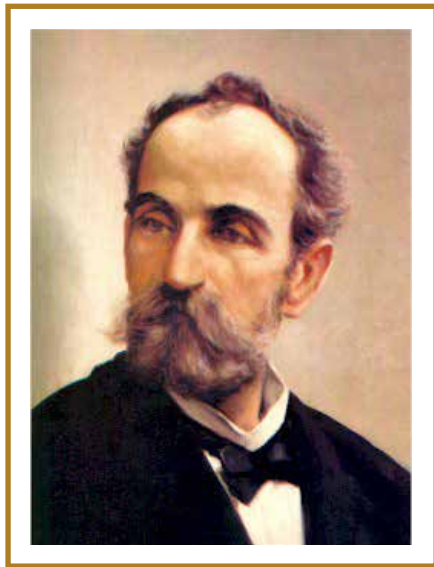
##### Brazil and Paraguay, 1872.

Foundation of the city of Lima.

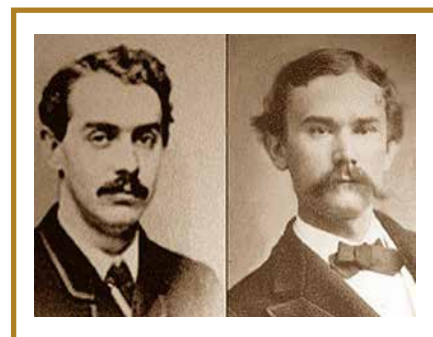


### **JANUARY 20<sup>TH</sup>** **Peru, 1839**

Signing of the Hay-Herrán Treaty for the construction of the Panama Canal.

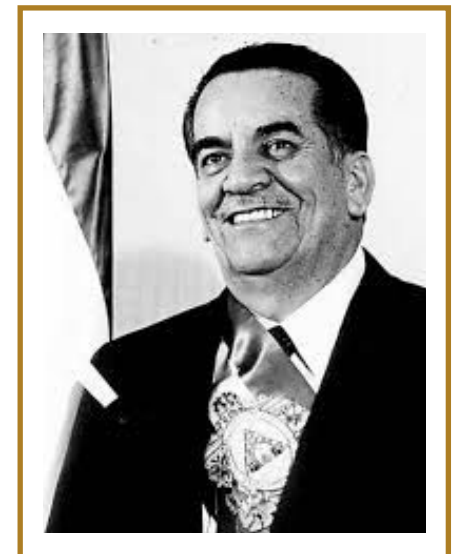


### **JANUARY 25<sup>TH</sup>** **Brazil, 1554**
