

FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF AMERICAN STATES



The First International Conference of American States was held on October 2nd, 1890, in Washington, D.C., with the presence of all the governments of the hemisphere, with the exception of the Dominican Republic. The objective of this conference was:

to discuss and recommend their corresponding Governments the implementation of an arbitration plan for the settlement of disagreements and disputes that may hereafter arise between them; to consider issues related to the improvement of reciprocal business relationships and means of direct communication between said countries; to encourage such reciprocal commercial relations since it

will be beneficial to all and secure more extensive markets for the products of each of said countries.¹

In this meeting, the establishment of an International Union of American Republics was agreed, which eventually became the Pan American Union, that passed judgment via the Pan American Conferences, held between 1889 and 1948. Finally, these gave way to the founding of the Organization of Americans States (OAS) in 1948.

Progressively, different institutions were incorporated aiming at facilitating cooperation on specific issues. The Pan American Institute of Geography and History (PAIGH) was created in 1928, during

the VI Pan American Conference, for the advancement of the sciences that correspond to its field of action: Cartography, Geophysics, Geography and History. Through an agreement, it became the first specialized agency of the OAS in 1949.

The History Commission of the PAIGH, created in accordance with Resolution XXVII at the IV General Assembly of the PAIGH in 1946, aims for studying the historical processes, current realities and their impact on the future of the continent, through collective and regional research,

the publication of books and specialized magazines, as well as the organization and participation in scientific meetings. Likewise, it finances projects with a Pan-American perspective on the history, culture, anthropology and archeology of the countries of the Americas. It also promotes policies that facilitate access to historical information and its dissemination; at the same time it sponsors communication and exchange between researchers of historical and social sciences in the Americas.

OCTOBER 5TH

1988, Brazil

Promulgation of the Constitution of the Federal Republic

OCTOBER 7TH

2012, Venezuela

Perfect Victory Day: Hugo Chávez is elected as president for the third consecutive time.



OCTOBER 9TH

1820, Ecuador

Independence of the city of Guayaquil from the Spanish crown: it marked the beginning of the war of independence of the Royal Audience of Quito.

OCTOBER 10TH

1868, Cuba

The Ten Years War begins; It was the first of the three Cuban wars of independence.



OCTOBER 11TH

1811, Chile.

The Free Womb Project: frees children born of slaves and prohibits the entry of new slaves into the country.

OCTOBER 12TH

1492

Discovery of America; also known as The Meeting of the Two Worlds or Day of the Races.



OCTOBER 14TH

1813

Simón Bolívar is recognized as Liberator of Venezuela



OCTOBER 15TH

1979, El Salvador

President Carlos Romero is overthrown by a coup d'etat and replaced in power by the Revolutionary Government Junta.

OCTOBER 18TH

1929, Canada

Recognition of women as subjects of rights and legal persons.

OCTOBER 30TH

1883, Chile and Peru


Signing of the Treaty of Ancón: puts an end to the Pacific War and stabilizes the post-war relations between them.



OCTOBER 22ND

1810, Mexico

The insurgent leader Miguel
Hidalgo is recognized as
"Generalissimo of the Americas".



OCTOBER 24TH

1945

Foundation of the United Nations.

OCTOBER 26TH

1998, Ecuador and Peru

Signing of the Brasilia
Presidential Act that ends the border conflict.



OCTOBER 28TH

1836

A decree establishes the Peru-Bolivian Confederation, made up of the Norperuano State, the Surperuano State and the Republic of Bolivia.



OCTOBER 29TH

1821, Costa Rica.

Signing of the Act of Independence: it declares the absolute emancipation from Spain and the rejection of the possible annexation to the Mexican Empire.



OCTOBER 31ST

2004, Uruguay

Tabaré Vázquez is elected president; it was the first time in the country that the left, through the Frente Amplio party, accesses power.
